Another August, another new group of Amate House Volunteers! We welcomed our 27 new Volunteers into our 32nd year of service to the City and Archdiocese of Chicago. This year's group, including one second-year Volunteer and two siblings of recent Amate House Alumni, moved into their communities in Chicago during the first weekend of August.

That Sunday, they were joined by family, friends, Staff, Board Members, and a few rainclouds on August 3rd at the Amate's Annual Commissioning Mass and BBQ. After two full weeks of orientation, the Volunteers made their commitment to Amate House during a Covenant Signing ceremony on the evening of August 12th in the Prayer Garden at South House.

The evening of the Covenant Signing, Volunteers and Staff welcomed back Founders Ken Brucks and John Haggerty to share the story of Amate House's creation and early years. Their telling of the experience was humbling and encouraging

to the Volunteers who are excited to begin their work as being the hands and feet of Christ throughout the city of Chicago.

This year's Volunteers are serving at 24 different sites throughout the city, including two new partnerships - New Moms, Inc. and Heartland Human Care Services.


It was a very busy summer here at Amate House. We have been making renovations to our three properties. The South House kitchen has been completely remodeled, and the renovation is 95% complete! We still need to install a ceiling exhaust fan and some heating vents. Many thanks to Jean Addante and Pat Kinsella for their hard work on this project! At the Little Village House, we added a new sewer to lessen the occurrence of standing water and moderate flooding in the basement. We also put heat in the basement, which will keep the Volunteers warm in the winter months and safe from the hazard of overusing personal space heaters. Construction at the Loman House, which was donated to us last year, continues. We hope to be finished by the end of this month, and when all is said and done, this property will be able to house six Volunteers starting in Fall of 2016.

I am grateful for the opportunity to continue to lead this great organization as we begin our 32nd year of putting "Love in Action" all across Chicago. On August 12th our new group of 27 Volunteers gathered for the signing of the Amate House Covenant. Prior to the signing, John Haggerty and Ken Brucks, two of the Amate House Founders, joined for dinner and conversation with the Volunteers. Their enthusiasm, humor and dedication are dynamic and inspirational. Later, in the presence of the Amate House Staff, each Volunteer was called forward to sign the Amate House Covenant. They pledged to uphold the five tenets of Amate House - Service, Community, Faith, Social Justice and Stewardship - throughout their year of service. These Covenants will be displayed at each house to remind the Volunteers of their commitment to each other and the tenets of Amate House.

As we move forward into our 32nd year, Amate House would like to thank Sr. Kathy Brazda, Fr. Tom Dore, Tom Judge, and Shanna Palmersheim for their wisdom and support over the years as Board Members. They will be missed but not forgotten for all of their hours of service to Amate House. Sarah Baum (Amate Alum 2003-2005), Raymond Loman, and Katherine O'Halloran will be joining our Board of Directors this fall, and we are excited and grateful they answered the call to join our Board of Directors! Living the Gospel By the Numbers

A numerical perspective of how Amate House Volunteers are answering Pope Francis's call to Service

Chicago is a BIG city. With over 75 neighborhoods and the third largest population in the country, it can be overwhelming to undertake the task of forming community, creating growth and sustainability in neighborhoods, and, most importantly, meeting and walking with those on the margins of society.

In his recent Encyclical titled "Evangelii Gaudium," Pope Francis says,

"An evangelizing community gets involved in word and deed in people's daily lives; it bridges distances, it is willing to abase itself if necessary, and it embraces human life, touching the suffering of Christ in others."

So how do the Amate House Volunteers bridge the distance? How do they embrace the human lives of over 20,000 people every year? All across the city, our Volunteers serve in full-time positions at various partnering organizations called Service Sites. They feed the hungry, give hope to those who feel all hope is lost, educate future community leaders, and walk with those who have lost their way. With the support of our Volunteers, these Service Sites are able to continue to provide quality services for those in need.

The relationship between Amate House and our partnering Service Sites are an integral part to the experience of each of our Volunteers. For example, many of our Volunteers go on to continue working for the Service Sites after their year of service.

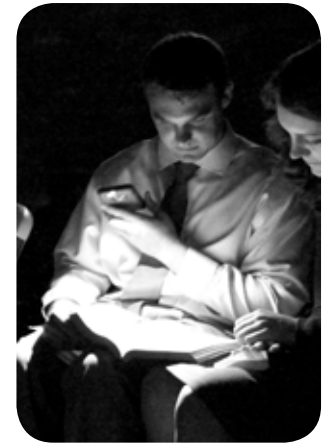
“Living the Gospel By the Numbers” continued...
